From January through to July 2010, the Quilt Museum and Gallery worked with members of the York Unifying Multicultural Initiative network on a project entitled 'York – A Patchwork of Culture'. The aim of the project was to teach new patchwork and guilting skills, share experiences and create an artwork on the theme of identity for the YUMI festival in July.

Participants came from many different parts of the world, including India, China, Poland, Russia, USA, New Zealand and Britain. Their sewing experience and knowledge about guilting varied hugely, from complete beginner and non English speaker to a City and Guilds qualified crafter.

After a five-week course in patchwork and quilting taught by local textile artist Christine Shaw and the Museum's Education Officer, YUMI members and their friends were invited to create a patchwork block based on the theme of identity, culture or celebrating where they lived.

Block makers worked at home or attended 'Community Quilters' workshops at the Museum once a month. The finished blocks were put together by volunteers at the Quilt Museum and Gallery and the banner displayed at the Festival in July.
